This Indenture made and executed this 21st of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between John Middleton as Trustee to the first part and Benjamin Harrison on the 26th day of March 1827. For the benefit of John Harris and Henry Allen of the one part and the said Benjamin Harrison of the other part all of the County of Southampton Wilmslow that whereas since the execution of the said deed in trust which contained any record in the Court of the County of said the said Benjamin Harrison had fully paid & discharged the debt for which the said deed in trust was made to secure and is desirous that the tract of Land conveyed in the said deed in trust should be released to him from all incumbrances whatsoever. In respect thereof the said Benjamin Harrison as Trustee of said deed in trust for the consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said Benjamin Harrison as witness for and in the further consideration of the instructions of the said Henry Allen that the said tract of Land should be released to him the said Harrison signified by his lawyer Harry Harris do hereby release and convey to the said Benjamin Harrison the said tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred and thirty seven p^{cs} acres be the same more or less and bounded as in the said deed in trust is set forth and known by the name of the First and Second Sections. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land unto him the said Benjamin Harrison his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or demand of myself or my heirs or any other person claiming the same by through or under me as Trustee of said deed in trust.
