Burnell Williams of the County aforesaid of the other part Mr Wm Bell Esq. the said John Lewis is for consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him the said John Lewis in his hand paid the said Richard W. Burnell Williams equally therewithal said John Lewis doth hereby acknowledge and pay these presents his due John Lewis Trustee as aforesaid hath given it in bargains and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Richard W. Burnell Williams equally, his heirs & assigns forever certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid on Black Water River supposed to contain two hundred and sixtysix more or less & adjoining the Pond of John Bryton & John Dryden being the land formerly owned by Spencer P. Jenkins deceased appertaining thereto a pertaining unto the said tract or parcel of Land whatsoever of him the said John Lewis as trustee was aforesaid hath given to the said Richard W. Burnell Williams part or parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances to the said Richard W. Burnell Williams equally to him and his heirs & assigns forever and he the said John Lewis as aforesaid his heirs & assigns doth covenant and agree with the said Richard W. Burnell Williams that he will warrant and forever defend the right and title which is vested in him the said John Lewis by virtue of a deed of trust executed to him by the aforesaid Thomas Bond on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1827 an unexecuted Mr Wm Bell Esq. the said John Lewis as aforesaid hath his and her husband and wife affixed his seal that day and year above written
