

(83) John W. Whitfield his Exors & Creditors all fail to pay the aforesaid debt interest & costs as aforesaid  
at the time of being there requires that thereupon the request in writing either of the said  
Thomas Burns his Exors above or a copy of the sum John W. Whitfield his Exors & Creditors shall  
be punctually not only so but the duty of the said Jacob Burns to make immediate sale of the  
above described land at public auction for ready money at the publick Drawing office at least  
fifteen days previous to the time and place of sale intimated by advertisement  
posted up in at least three public places in the said County and thereafter proceed  
of such sale after paying and satisfying all costs attending the execution of this to be applied by  
the said Jacob Burns to the discharge of the aforesaid debt including the interest thereon  
which is due & owing to the said Thomas Burns as aforesaid so much drawed money  
thereover and if any surplus of money therof remains in the hands of the said Jacob  
Burns it shall be paid over to the said John W. Whitfield his Exors a/c a/c and in  
case the aforesaid debt interest costs of drawing & recording be paid as before required as  
aforesaid in such case the said Jacob Burns is to release to the said John W. Whitfield  
or those in reversion of him all the title herein being transferred to him and in case  
the said Jacob Burns shall die before the full execution of his Exors & Creditors shall  
carry this Indenture into effect & operation and the said John W. Whitfield by these presents  
warrants and forever hereafter definds the full free and uninterrupted title of himself to  
the before described land and every part and parcel of the same to him called Jacob Burns  
his heirs and assigns forever against the claim and claims of all and every person and

This Indenture made and entered into this the 5<sup>th</sup> day September in the Year of  
our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven Between Miles Glade &  
Elly his wife of the one part and James Cotton black man of the other part all of the County  
of Southampton and State of Virginia WITNESSETH that the said Miles Glade and Elly his  
wife for and in consideration of the just and full sum of Twenty four Dollars in current  
money of Virginia to him by the said James Cotton in hand paid the receipt whereof the  
said Miles Glade doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and by  
these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said James Cotton his heirs & assigns  
a certain tract of land containing seven and one half acres to the same more or less  
as lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia as aforesaid the  
boundaries whereof to be more to hold as follows beginning at a high wood  
3d corner post South west running east joining 1st post line to Spruce pine  
then corner running due north the course joining the said Cotton on the east side and  
then corner at a large pine standing at the end running west with the road to the said  
Glades fence and then corner at a small pine then runs a south course joining said fence  
on the West side to the first named corner. 3d corner whereupon to have and to hold the  
said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereunto belonging to him  
the said James Cotton his heirs & assigns to the present and behoof of the said  
James Cotton his heirs and assigns persons and the said Miles Glade for himself  
his heirs and assigns Exors & Creditors with liberty to enclose & agree to and with
