This Indenture made and entered into this 19th day of May 1828 between
 Henry Baron of the first part James Rockelle of the second part and John W Mason of the third
 part witness. In consideration whereof the said Henry Baron is justly indebted to the said John W Mason
 in the sum of five hundred Dollars due by note of equal date herewith the payment
 whereof with the accruing interest thereon he is willing and desirous to secure to the
 said Mason This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the
 premises and of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Rockelle
 before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 in writing. Baron hath sold and delivered and by these presents doth sell and convey to the said
 James Rockelle the following property (that is) three horses two mules forty five hogs fifteen
 head of cattle one side board four beds stands of furniture one clock one secretary one
 dozen Windsor Chairs two washstands one negro man slave named Amos aged
 about thirty years and the surplus of property or money which may remain after
 paying and satisfying the debts and incident expenses secured to him by his
 by Masters of Court now after record in the Clerks office of Southampton for the particular
 article of property reference is hereby made to the said Deeds to have and hold
 the said property to him the said Rockelle his heirs &c forever upon trust nevertheless
 that the said Baron is to be permitted to keep in his possession the said property until the 25th
 day of December next when if the said sum of five hundred Dollars shall still remain
 owing part thereof or any part of the interest therein the said Rockelle is hereby authorized
 and required to take possession of the said property herein conveyed and after advertising
 the forward place of sale for ten days sell the same or so much as may be necessary
 for the purpose aforesaid and pay off the process the said sum of five hundred Dollars
 with interest thereon from this day to the said Mason and the costs attending the
 execution of this trust and the balance if any pay or deliver to the said Henry Baron

This Indenture made the 1st day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty
 eight between Charles W Goodwyn of the one part and John M Gurley of the other part all of
 the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that whereas the aforesaid
 named Charles W Goodwyn stands justly indebted to Leitchbury Mason of the County and
 State aforesaid in the sum and sum of seven hundred and forty Dollars and eighty eight
 cents by bond bearing date with these presents. The said Charles W Goodwyn desirous to secure
 his the same and for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid to the said
 Charles W Goodwyn by cheques and John M Gurley at and before the sealing and delivery of
 these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and the said Charles W Goodwyn
 doth by these presents doth bargain sell and Confirm unto the aforesaid John M Gurley or
 his attorney one certain tract of land containing ninety acres more or less known
 by the name of Cowells place adjoining lands of James Powell & William Norton the
 above described tract of land to have and to hold the aforesaid land and premises and appur-
 tenances unto him the said John M Gurley his heirs and assigns forever and the aforesaid Charles
 W Goodwyn doth hereby covenant to and with the said John M Gurley for himself his heirs and assigns
 forever to warrant and defend the right and title whereof to him the following personal property
 that is to say one negro man named Arthur one nameless boy all of which the aforesaid Charles W
 Goodwyn further covenants and agrees for himself and his heirs and assigns forever to warrant and defend
