This Indenture made the 17th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between Robert Le Selk of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part and Kinchen Selk of the same County & State of the other part Wherefore that the said Robert Selk for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and fifty dollars Lawful money of Virginia to him here paid before the dealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said Kinchen Selk his heirs and assigns forever a certain Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid on the South side of the Potomac River containing thirty acres the same more or less and bounded as follows (To wit) Beginning at a pine a new corner standing in the same place along the line to a China Tree in the yard containing & binding thence north to a pine a corner in Parkers Woods line thence along his line of marked trees east to a pine a new corner made in said Lot 7th line thence South along a line of ^{slight} new marked binding on Lot 7th 8th 9th 10th 11th belonging to said Wrenn to a white oak a new corner on said line & Lot 10th 11th thence west along said Wrenn's line to a pine Beginning at Lot 10th 11th thence being the 6th and my Patrimonial Lot of the lands of Kinchen Selk so as who was my father To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Kinchen Selk to be held by him his heirs and assigns forever and the said Robert Le Selk for my self and my heirs and of all and every other person or persons whomsoever claiming under them shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. Claudioff now resides lying and being in the County and State aforesaid bounded on the north by the three creeks on the west by the lands of Joseph Holt on the South by the lands of Major John Derry on the East by the lands now contained for by Benjamin Williamson & the wife of John Derry and containing five hundred & forty acres be the same more or less with all the buildings improvements and appurtenances thereon & thereto belonging
