This Indenture made this third day of June in the Year four Geo 1828 between Joseph D. Whitchurch Deputy for William M. Cantrillish Marshall of the Superior Court of Chancery for the Williamsburg District of the one part and Robert Goodwyn of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Joseph D. Whitchurch Deputy for William M. Cantrillish in pursuance of a Decree of the Superior Court of Chancery for the Williamsburg District pronounced on the 23rd day of February 1828 in the case of John M. G. v. James Rochelle adm^r of Samuel Kello & George Gurley Ex^{rs} of Josiah Vick and others and of a sale made by him by virtue of said Decree by public Auction of the one half of the undivided Lots 111 and 112 in said Decree at which sale the said Robert Goodwyn became the purchaser for the sum of five hundred and one dollar and on consideration of the said sum of five hundred and one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Robert Goodwyn before the sealing and delivery of the presents hereafter granted bargain and sold and released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell and release and confirm unto the said Robert Goodwyn his heirs and assigns the said one half of the undivided Lots whereof Samuel Kello died seized and possessed above mentioned situated in the Town of Jerusalem in the County of Southampton and adjoining in the plain of said Town to the burial of 18 & 19. together with all and singular the buildings cases and messuages heretofore and appurtenances whatsoever unto the said one half of the two undivided Lots belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have & to hold the said one half of the two undivided Lots with the Tenements heretofore mentioned & singular other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargain and sold unto the said Robert Goodwyn his heirs and assigns forever. To have for the only purposes and behoof of Robert Goodwyn his heirs and assigns forever. and that from and of all Claim and incumbrance by the said Joseph D. Whitchurch Deputy for William M. Cantrillish and all persons claiming by through or under him and not otherwise. In Witness whereof the said Joseph D. Whitchurch Deputy for William M. Cantrillish Marshall and aforesaid hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first above written.
