 Francis Clements of the said County of the second part. Wherein it is shewn that the said Hardy Harris &
 Elizabeth E Harris for and in consideration of the sum of thirty, hundred and sixty seven Dollars
 of lawful money of the Commonwealth to them on hand paid by the said Francis Clements
 at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have bargained and sold and by these presents do give and sell unto the said
 Francis Clements his heirs and assigns two certain Tracts or parcels of Land lying and being in
 the County of Greenwell and Southernmost that Tract in Greenwell immediately on the
 South Bank of the Merriam River and bounded as follows by the Lands of Benjamin Williamson
 Junior Turner's Estate and the Merriam River containing by recent survey two hundred and
 forty six acres that Tract in Southampton lying on the opposite side of the said River
 bounded by the Lands of Mary Smith Sol McSore's Estate and the Merriam River
 containing by recent survey three hundred and fifty four acres one hundred and two acres of
 the last mentioned is subject to the claim of Mr. Smith's Son of the said County of South-
 ampton. To have and to hold the said Tracts of Land with the tenements thereunto
 and all and singular the premises hereunto before mentioned unto the said Francis Clements his heirs
 and assigns forever. And for the duly proper use & behoof
 of him the said Francis Clements his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Hardy Harris
 and Elizabeth E Harris for themselves and their heirs the said Tracts of Land and singular
 the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Francis Clements his heirs
 & assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Hardy Harris & Elizabeth E Harris wife
 or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever.
