This Indenture made the twenty fifth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight Between John Moore & Delilah his wife of the one part James Moore of the other part all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said John Moore and Delilah his wife for ever in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy five dollars To them well and lawfully paid by the said James Moore at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said John Moore and Delilah his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James Moore his heirs and assigns all the interest right title and claim of the said John Moore in and to the lands of which Peter Moore was seized and possessed which was devised by his last will and Testament of the said land to be equally divided among four of his children (viz) James John Mary and Harry which division has been affected by consent appurtenances and without fault of the mother who is entitled to a dower right for life in the whole of said land the lot known by the said John Moore and which is intended to be conveyed by this Indenture is bounded as follows Beginning at a small Gum a corner of said James Moore's Lot and on N. E. S. E. side thence along said ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~upper~~ ^{line} to Delilah Moore's line thence along his line to a stake a corner of Mary Moore's Lot thence along the said Mary Moore's line East only across the ~~perhaps~~ Branch to the back of Lane called and known by the name of the old South Ferry past thence along said line to James Moore's corner thence westerly to the beginning containing six acre more or less the reversion and reversions unincumbered and unmortgaged yearly and other fruits issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof To Have and to hold the said tract or parcels of land with the tenements hereditaments and all incidents singular other the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said James Moore his heirs & assigns forever And the said John Moore & Delilah his wife for themselves their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises & appurtenances before mentioned unto the said James Moore his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of whomsoever the said John Moore & Delilah transfer either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever Shall well and do warrant and forever defend by their ~~present~~
