This Indenture made this second day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight by and between Albridge Jones of Southampton County and John of Virginia first part and Samuel Cobleson and Leonard Cobb of the second part. Where both said Albridge Jones for and in consideration of one thousand dollars well and lawfully received to him now paid by the said Harrison and Cobb before the date hereof and clear of all debts and claims to the receipt of him of the said Albridge Jones but granted bargain and sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto them the said Samuel Cobleson and Leonard Cobb their heirs and assigns forever the choice of a certain fishing or deer beach that shall be called Oak grove being in the County of Southampton and lying on the east side of the Wherry River and bounded as follows Viz Beginning at a Buck the upper part of the dam or dam in a fishery known by the name of George Sted's formerly owned by Henry Harrison from thence down the river to another but distant from the first about four hundred yards & extending back & forth from the margin of the river the whole length of the beach or from that to put to have and to hold the said fishing or deer beach together with all the lands profits and appurtenances unto the same belonging to them the said Samuel Cobleson & Leonard Cobb their heirs and assigns forever and the said Albridge Jones for himself his heirs & assigns doth by these presents warrant and defend the said bargain premises against the lawful claim or demand of all and every person whatsoever to whom the said Samuel Cobleson & Leonard Cobb their heirs and assigns forever In Testimony whereof the said Albridge Jones has hereunto set his hand and seal the day & year above written

This Indenture made and entered into this 10th May 1828 Between Presley Barnes of the first part William Everett of the second part and John Ingo of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Where both said Presley Barnes doth hereby and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William Everett the sum of one hundred and forty four dollars due by two Bonds bearing Equal date with these presents one for sixty more dollars on demand 1st of September next the other for twenty five dollars on demand the first day of February next and being desirous and willing to receive the said debts unto him the said John Ingo have this day for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him now paid by the said William Everett the receipt whereof he hereby acknowledges granted bargain and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William Everett the premises and the following property to wit one Sorrel horse one riding saddle one fiddle two leather Bags & furniture the whole of his Crop of Cotton fodder and corn except fifteen Bunches of muskrat able corn unto him the said William Everett in the said Presley Barnes for himself his heirs & assigns doth warrant and forever defend upon Trust nevertheless as follows (To wit) In the said William Everett being instructed by a letter of the first Tuesday after the first day of September next shall after giving fifteen days notice of the time and place proceed to sell at public sale so much of the property conveyed in this deed as shall
