This Indenture made this 3rd day of June in the year of our Lord 1825 between J. S. J. Whitelaw Deputy for William McCandlish of the Superior Court of Chancery for the District of Columbia and George G. Gurley of the other part. Witnesseth that the said J. S. J. Whitelaw Deputy for William McCandlish in pursuance of a decree of the Superior Court of Chancery for the District of Columbia pronounced on the 25th day of January 1825 in the case of Thomas Depledge White Collon McCandlish vs. John P. Whitelaw John W. Galt and others against Henry Briggs adm^r with the Clerk of the Court John Crechton and others and of a sale made by him by virtue of said decree by public auction of the lands named in said Decree at which the said George G. Gurley became the purchaser for the sum of two hundred and fifty five dollars and in consideration of the said sum of two hundred and fifty five dollars to him in hand paid by the said George G. Gurley before the said long and delivery of these presents hath given grant bargain and sold unto and released unto and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto and release unto and confirm unto the said George G. Gurley his heirs and assigns the said tract or parcel of Lands above mentioned situated in the County of Southampton adjoining the lands of Joel Woodell and Mrs. Calvert &c. containing one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the buildings ways easements hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of Land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversions reversioners remainders and remainders yearly and other rents issues & profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said George G. Gurley with the tenants hereditaments and all and singular which the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold unto the said George G. Gurley his heirs and assigns forever To and for the only proper use behoof of him the said George G. Gurley his heirs and assigns forever and that free and clear of all claim and incumbrance by the said J. S. J. Whitelaw for Wm McCandlish and all persons claiming by through or under him &c. and others. In Witness whereof the said Joseph B. This Indenture made this thirtyeth day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between Elbert C. Williams and wife Lucy Williams formerly Lucy Washington of the County of Robertson & State of Tennessee of the one part and Sadrach Boyer of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Elbert C. Williams & Washington late of the County of State last aforesaid did intend to bargain and sell unto said County which descended to the said Lucy Williams & Joseph Washington known as Washington and Amelia Clayton formerly of Amelia Washington now wife of James Clayton as heirs and legatees of said Elbert C. Washington and Son &c. in respect for the consideration of the sum of ten dollars
