as clear from the claim or claims of himself his and the said Chapman or any other person  
persons whatsoever shall warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness

T<sup>r</sup> twenty dollars and fourteen pence in hand paid by John E. Mason & Samuel H. Finsler Trustee  
Mason for Lett. P<sup>t</sup> of Tr<sup>y</sup> No<sup>o</sup> 1 by and with their consent do hereby release & discharge a negro man slave  
named Job. Coney to the John Drake to whom he payment of debts, money  
and interest to the said P<sup>t</sup> of Tr<sup>y</sup> No<sup>o</sup> 1 being the amount of his principal interest  
and cost of said debt and attorney, said trust and the said John Drake for the further sum of  
two hundred and twenty two dollars eight pence cents to whom he paid have bargained, sold  
and by these presents do bargain and sell to the said John E. Mason and his heirs the said  
negro slave Job, warranting a good and perfect title to the same the said negro to remain  
in possession of George G. Gurley until Christmas who is to pay to the said Mason his  
hire for the balance of the year. In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our  
hands at Bald Hill 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 1828.
