This Indenture made and entered into on the 21st day of July eighteen hundred and forty eight between
Nicholas Brown of Hertford County and State of North Carolina of the one part and Mason Hell of the
County of New Hanover and State of Ferguson of the other part witnesseth that the said Nicholas
Brown for and in consideration of the sum of Thirty dollars current money of this Commonwealth
to him in hand paid by the said Mason Hell before delivery and delivery of these
Indents whereof he hereby acknowledge to have paid to him and doth by this present Indenture
bargain and sell unto and by assignment to the said Mason Hell his heirs and assigns forever or certain
part or parts of his lands lying and situated in the said County of New Hanover and Parish of St. Luke
containing by estimation Eight acres to the same more or less bounded on the west by the
lands of Richard Williamson and on the north East and South by the lands of William
Hell due to the said Nicholas Brown as aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with its
appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining together with all rights thereunto
concerning and of it and the land unto the said Mason Hell his heirs and assigns forever and
to the only proper use and behoof of the said Mason Hell and his heirs forever and
the said Nicholas Brown for himself his heirs and assigns doth hereby covenant and agree
and with the said Mason Hell his heirs and assigns doth hereby declare and warrant
and for ever defend the right and title of the said Nicholas Brown and his heirs
parcel thereof against the claim or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever
Entitl'd thereto the said Nicholas Brown having his hand and affixed his
seal thereto and date first written

By my self witnesseth This Indenture made and entered into on this 9th day of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and thirty four by me between Seward Bryant George Whit-
field and Polly Whitfield wife to the said George Whitfield setting party and Jacob Burnes,
Esq^r attorney all of us the above named parties hereto of the County of Southampton in the State of
Virginia the said Davis Bryant son was conveyed by the said George Whitfield the title of
a certain tract of Land in Trust by a deed in writing bearing date the 19th day of January 1818
for purposes wherein mentioned which deed is now record in the Clerks office for the present
County of Southampton on this Indenture witnesseth that the said Davis Bryant as requested
by the said George Whitfield to release to the above named Jacob Burnes by paying in the
sum of the following described lot or parcel of Land the same being the same being a part & apart
only of the same conveyed as aforesaid this Indenture further witnesseth that the said Davis
Bryant in consideration that it be his duty and the said George Whitfield and Polly his wife
in consideration of the sum of fifty five dollars to him in hand paid by the said Jacob Burnes
at and before the ensaing and delivery of these presents doth well receipt whereof I hereby acknowledge
and have by me signed and sealed by these presents bargained sold unto him the said
Jacob Burnes his heirs and assigns as follows that it be known by the said Davis Bryant
George Whitfield and Polly Whitfield his wife have granted bargained and sold and doth by these
presents grant bargain and sell unto him the said Jacob Burnes his heirs & assigns forever
the fee simple estate in and to one certain lot or parcel of Land lying and being in
the aforesaid County of Southampton containing four acres of Land being identical
with the same land which the aforesaid names Jacob Burnes and his wife Polly Rector
Whitfield about fifteen years past which said land was so record in the
Clerks office for the aforesaid County the boundaries of the said four acres of Land
truly conveyed correctly appear by referring to the said deed to Rector Whitfield
to have and to hold the four acres of Land and every part thereof unto him
