We the undersigned do certify all to whom it may concern that in a certain deed by and between us bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three which is of record in the Clerk's office for the above named County, whereby conveying to Jacob Barnes in said County the title and fee simple to a certain lot or parcel of land lying on the ... on the ...  
County, and said to contain fifty acres of land more or less and whose exactness may be somewhat different between the adjoining land ... as is referred to in the said deed and that said deed by the court and distance in said deed and at such difference may possibly exist owing to the ... in ...  
adjoining lands being imperfectly known and shown at the time the said land conveyed as aforesaid was surveyed and we the undersigned do each of us now say that the object of said deed was to convey title as aforesaid and as we did convey or intended thereby convey and if not we do hereby convey to Jacob Barnes in fee simple all lands of ours to the full extent of his adjoining lands of all other individuals and furthermore we the undersigned do hereby acknowledge that we have received of Jacob Barnes of full compensation for the land ... be it more or less than fifty acres having reference to the land named in the deed aforesaid and furthermore we do hereby acknowledge and defend the title as such to the over quantity of land of such extent to have the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns forever. *Witness* the hands and seals of us each of us hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this day of ... 1828.
