second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the
said Jemmett Jones for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred and forty Dollars
to her in hand paid by the said William A. Jones at and before the making and delivery of these
premises the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained sold
conferred unto the said William A. Jones his heirs and assigns forever all of the dower right title
interest in and to that tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton on the
Neheer River containing by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less which
said tract or parcel of Land she the said Jemmett Jones claims in right of her dower
from the lands Estate of her former husband Cordy Keliston unto him and to
William A. Jones she also named tract of Land bounded out by Jones and all appurtenances
the appurtenances thereto appertaining or in any way belonging also her dower
right in and to a negro man by name Jacob which right was obtained in
same way as the Land before named as well her full simple right title in &
