This Indenture made the 28th day of July 1828 Between George B Curley & Lucy his
wife of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part and John Thomas of
the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said George B Curley &
Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of six thousand and sixty five Dollars
to them in hand paid by the said John Thomas at or before the sealing and delivery of this
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged each granted bargained and sold and by
these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John Thomas his heirs & assigns
forever in certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton
containing by a late survey One hundred and twenty Eight acres three Rods & thirty five
Poles the boundaries may be known by reference to a report of the Commissioners
appointed at November Court 1825 to divide the Land sold by a decree of the Chancery Court
of Williamsburg belonging at that time to the Estate of John Crechman which said Land
has been sold by a subsequent decree of the aforesaid Chancery Court of Williamsburg by
Joseph Whithead Deputy for William McCandlish Marshall of the said Chancery
Court of Williamsburg and the said George B Curley is and was the purchaser thereof
reference to the deed from the said Whithead to the said Curley now of record in the
Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton the same well more fully appears
also one other Tract of Land containing sixty one acres of Land more or less which was
also sold by the said Joseph Whithead Deputy as aforesaid by virtue of a decree
of the Chancery Court of Williamsburg and the said George B Curley became the
purchaser reference to the said deed from the said Whithead to the said Curley now of
record in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton the same well
more fully appears the boundaries of which said last mentioned Tract of Land will more fully
appear by reference to a deed from Josiah Vick his wife to John Crechman & his heirs
