This Indenture made this 18th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between James Cooper and Araminta his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and George B. Barry of the other part. Witnesseth that we the said James Cooper and Araminta his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and twenty dollars to us in hand paid by the said George Barry the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged each sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said George B. Barry to him and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton on the South side of Forts Road containing twenty acres more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at Forts Road thence Southeastwardly to a black jack thence to a red oak thence to a willow oak standing in the head of a small branch thence to a white oak thence to a small pine made in place of a red oak which is now dead thence to a pine a corner in James Foster's land thence easterly to scrub oak near the old road thence up the said road to Forts Road thence up Forts Road to beginning To have and to hold the said Land and premises with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said George Barry to be held by him and his heirs forever and we the said James Cooper and Araminta his wife for ourselves our heirs and every other person and persons whatsoever claiming under us do and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. Bynum In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th of November 1823.
