This Indenture made the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven between Anselm Denson and Sally his wife of Southampton County of the one part and Blawkins Pond of the said County of the other part. WITNESSETH that the said Anselm Denson and Sally his wife do and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and eighty eight dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said Blawkins Pond before the ensigning and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Blawkins Pond his heirs and assigns all their right title and interest in a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation seventy seven acres to the same more or less and bounded by the lands of Thomas Hart, Isaac Bailey, Anthony Andrew and the said Blawkins Pond it being all the land which the said Denson purchased at different times of John Washington dec<sup>d</sup> and the reversion & remainder remained and remained yearly and other rents, issues and profits therefrom of part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract of Land with his tenements her easements and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or which to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights manors and appurtenances unto the said Blawkins Pond his heirs and assigns forever and the said Anselm Denson and Sally his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Blawkins Pond his heirs and assigns free from all claim or claims of them the said Anselm Denson and Sally his wife or either of them claim or either of them his heirs or assigns and of all and every further person or whatsoever shall well and do warrant and forever defend by these presents In WITNESS whereof the said Anselm Denson and Sally his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
