Simmons in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby granted. To have and to hold the said named negro slaves Stephen and Selvia and their increase to the said James Bell his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof to him the said James Bell his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof I the undersigned that should the said Richard H. Simmons fail to pay unto Edward Butts his heirs or assigns the just and full sum of one hundred and forty seven and ninety five cents with interest and costs which may accrue thereon and in that case the said James Bell at the request of either of the parties may sell after giving ten days notice of the time and place of sale for ready money and out of the proceeds of such sale pay the debt interest and all costs thereby accruing and the balance if any pay over to the said Richard Simmons or such person or persons as he may direct to receive the same. This Indenture made this 12th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between John Exum and Eleanor his wife of the one part and Henry Enon of the other part all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said John Exum and Eleanor his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifty nine dollars and fifty cents unto them in hand paid by the said Henry Enon the receipt whereof the said John Exum and Eleanor his wife all hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid and of the same by these presents acquit and release the said Henry Enon. And the said John Exum and wife doth grant bargain and sell also in fee simple confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell also in fee simple and confirm unto the said Henry Enon one certain tract plantation or parcel of Land containing by estimation about two hundred and twenty acres lying and being situate in the County of Southampton and state of Virginia. Bounded as follows Beginning at a white oak by Smithfield road corner for Henry Enon thence said Enon's line 1 1/2 p. N. 21. 5 p. to red oak corner for Wilson Allison thence said line 1 1/2 p. N. 21. 5 p. to pine stump corner S. 30 1/2. W. N. 3. 7 p. to pine S. 21 1/2. W. 6. 8 p. to red oak S. 10 1/2. N. 2 p. to white oak S. 31. W. N. 2 p. to small pine next made corner for said Wilson Enon thence a new line S. 14 1/2. E. 2. 2 p. to red oak corner S. 70 1/2. E.
