This Indenture made this 9th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight Between Hewitt Paule of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and John Womack Trustee of Henry Paule of the other part Witnesseth that the said Hewitt Paule in order to secure a certain sum of money and also Bonds of Hewitt Paule entered to Henry Paule for the sum of five hundred dollar he the said Hewitt Paule do hereby bargain and sell unto the said John Womack his Exor or adm^r & assigns three negro girls and one boy named Lucy Airy Violet and Harry one Bay mare my crop of every description as it stands two feather Beds and furniture one gun six setting chairs plantation tools of every kind To have and to hold the aforesaid property to him the said John Womack his Exor adm^r & assigns the said Hewitt Paule do hereby these presents warrant and defend the rights & title of the above mentioned property against the claim of any person whatever unto the said John Womack his Exor adm^r & assigns Nevertheless in Trust and Confidence that if the said Hewitt Paule should shall refuse or neglect to pay the sum above mentioned or shall delay to return the said Henry Paule then at the request of Henry Paule at any time after the 20th day of December 1828 shall proceed to sell after giving sufficient notice of the day of sale proceed to sell the aforesaid property ^{above mentioned} to the highest bidder for ready money and the money arising from such sale in the first place pay and satisfy all reasonable expenses attending such sale and the balance to be applied to the payment of the aforesaid debt but if it should prove to be any balance then the said John Womack shall pay over to Hewitt Paule all overplus money that arises from such sales to him or his Exors or assigns In Witness whereof I have set my hand and this 9th day of September 1828.
