This Indenture made this first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between Melis Scarborough of the first part John Palford of the second part Temperance Palford of the third part Witnesseth the said Melis Scarborough to secure a debt of thirty five dollars due Temperance Palford to be paid the first day of November next the said Melis Scarborough hath granted bargain and sold and by this presents doth grant bargain and sell to the said John Palford all my right title interest & claim to the Estate of James Palford due to the said John Palford his heirs & assigns forever upon Trust nevertheless in case the said Melis Scarborough shall fail to pay the above sum of thirty five dollars then the said John Palford may and shall by giving ten days public notice agreeable to Law proceed to sell the said interest to the highest bidder for cash & out of the money arising therefrom first pay the above sum of thirty five dollars and the contingent charges thereon and the balance if any pay to the said Melis Scarborough or his heirs &c. This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of September 1828 and between John G. Miller of the first part; Abigail (Edward) Murfee of the second part and James Murfee of the third part all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia Witnesseth that appeared the said John G. Miller stood singly indebted unto the said A. Edward in the sum of forty six dollars and eight cents lawful money of Virginia which appears by Bond bearing equal date with this indenture and the said Miller being desirous and indemnify the said A. Edward but more especially for and in consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said James Murfee the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James Murfee and his assigns forever one negro boy Gilbert and two children his issue upon the following to wit if the said Miller shall fail to pay and discharge the before mentioned debt when called for the said James Murfee so soon as order by the said A. Edward by a written notice shall advertise at three of the most public places in the neighborhood ten days before the day of sale and after giving such notice he shall set up and sell to the highest bidder for Virginia money the before mentioned property and out of the money arising from the sale thereof he shall satisfy the said debt with all the costs and expenses thereon and his heirs & assigns forever if any he shall pay over to the said Miller or his assigns In Testimony whereof we the said Miller & James Murfee did hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this day & date above written The within was signed & del. in the presence of James Wells & A.
