Barron I now all men by these presents that I Richard Barron of Southampton
 County for and in consideration of the fidelity and good conduct of my negro woman slave
 Susan, named Susan otherwise called Sucky, have manumitted emancipated and set free her
 said negro woman slave and do by these presents manumit emancipate and set free
 reserving to myself the right of her services during our joint lives or so long as I shall
 live at the expiration of which said time I hereby declare her the said Susan to be fully
 liberated from slavery and entitled to all the rights and privileges of a free person with which it
 is in my power to vest her. She the said Susan hereby liberated emancipated & man-
 mitted is a woman of a light yellowish complexion about five or six feet high and about
 thirty or forty years of age. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 20th day of October 1828.

 which I have or may have in the tract of Land which is now held and occupied by my
 mother Elizabeth Harris as her dower in the Estate of my father Henry Barron and
 situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton To have and to hold the
 aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises above mentioned with the appurtenances
 unto the said John T. Barron his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof
 him the said John T. Barron his heirs and assigns forever. And she the said
 Richard Barron for himself his heirs & assigns doth covenant and agree to & well
 the said John T. Barron his heirs and assigns forever that he the said Richard Barron
 and his heirs the said tract or parcel of Land and premises and every part thereof
