Myrick doth that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he hereby acknowledges have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Horatio Stevens above named one eighth part of the land of which Barnard Stevens the father of the said Elizabeth did and did contain three hundred eleven and a half acres by late survey by the same more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton on the north side of the hoplars Swamp with all and singular their several rights including the dwelling house and every part and parcel thereunto belonging which is hereby conveyed bargained and sold unto said Horatio Stevens free from the claims of all persons of what nature soever without exceptions which said right the said John Myrick and Elizabeth his wife do hereby warrant and defend unto the said Horatio Stevens and his heirs forever In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this day of date above written begun sealed &
