This Indenture made the twenty fifth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between leader Torrell and Joseph Torrell of the County of Southampton of the one part and Harvey A. Torrell of the County of Devon of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirty dollars in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by this presents do have given and sell unto the said Harvey A. Torrell their undivided one eighth part of the land of which the said Torrells the father of the said Joseph and said Harvey possessed containing three hundred acres and a half acres by late survey be the same more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton on the north side of the popular Swamp with all and singular their several rights including the dower thereunto belonging which is hereby conveyed bargained and sold unto the said Harvey A. Torrell free from the claims of all persons which said right the said leader Torrell and Joseph had and do have in and to the said Harvey A. Torrell and his heirs forever In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and date above written

This Indenture of three parts made this 16th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between George Branch of the County of Southampton Trustee of the third part whereas some unhappy differences have lately arisen between the said George Branch and Michel the wife and whereas the said Michel has instituted a suit for alimony against the said George in the County Court of Southampton which is still pending and undetermined and whereas the said George and Michel have mutually agreed to live separate and apart from each other and provided to each separation he the said George hath consented thereto and also proposed and agreed to relinquish all right and interest which he may have acquired in any property whether real or personal belonging to the said Michel by testamentary right and out of his own proper money all ten to the said Michel for his better support and maintenance the sum of one hundred dollars and also to pay the sum of twenty five dollars towards discharging the costs incurred in the prosecution of the suit for alimony.
