This Indenture made the 17th day of June eighteen hundred and twenty eight between Willis
Brown and Sally his wife of Southampton County of one part and John Crumples of the aforesaid
County of the other part witnesseth that the said Willis Brown and Sally his wife consent
and agree of thirty dollars lawful money of the Commonwealth to whom it shall be paid by the said
John Crumples at or before the end returning and delivering of these presents she accept whereof is
hereby acknowledged having bargained and sold and by these presents doth each of them sell bargain
and sell unto the said John Crumples the unmarked proportion of dominion in the lands formerly
belonging to before mentioned ^{the} containing ^{one} acre more or less together with all the
singular houses buildings yards gardens orchards &c. and the numerous appurtenances re-
maining and remaining to have and to hold the said unmarked proportion of the above
named Lands with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein
before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with
every of their rights &c. to the said John Crumples his heirs and assigns forever and also unto
Willis Brown and Sally his wife for themselves and their heirs the said parcel of Land
with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John
Crumples his heirs and assigns free from all claim or claims of whatsoever he said Willis
Brown and Sally his wife or either of them him or either of them his and or her assigns or
other person or persons whatsoever shall well and lawfully warrant and forever defend defend by
these presents. In witness whereof the said Willis Brown and Sally his wife have
hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first written written
