Griffin Trustees of the Trust for the County aforesaid do hereby certify that Benjamin Griffin the wife of William Griffin departed to the Acher's indenture for the conveyance of real Estate (viz) two orchards and one of Land to Henry's error bearing date the 12th day of October 1828. heretofore appeared before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately and apart from her said husband and having the said aforesaid being explained to her, she the said Benjamin Griffin acknowledges the same to be her act and deed, and declares that she has willingly signed Grants and delivered the same and that she wishes not to retract it. Indenture made and executed this 17th day of November in the 34th year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight Between John Middleton of the County of Southampton and Nathan Pope Jr of the other part (Whereupon the wife of the said Benjamin Pichette by his last will and Testament duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton among other things therein specified directed that certain Land belonging to his Estate should be sold more therefore I the said Nathan Middleton and I as aforesaid by virtue of and in strict pursuance of the said last will and Testament and in pursuance and by authority of the 5th Section of an Act reducing and in the several Acts concerning Wills distribution of intestate Estates and the duty of Executors and Administrators have advertised and sold the tract of Land called and known by the name of the Hammal's Tract which has lately been set apart to the Estate by Commissioners under a decree of the Chancery District Court of Williamsburg containing by reference to the names and number of the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit on the north by the land called the day plantation and now the property of Howell Pesse also the land of James Lack on to the east by the land of Edward Turner and the Land of Private Day formerly a part of the said tract on the South and West by the Land formerly Benjamin Pichette's of all of which more fully appears by reference to the Plat and Survey made by the County Surveyor together with the Report of the Commissioners returns and files in the Clerk's Office of the Chancery District Court of Williamsburg. At which sale the said Nathan Pope Jr became the purchaser of the said two hundred and ninety eight acres of Land the being the highest bidder at two dollars and eighty five cents per acre. Now the said Nathan Middleton as adm^r of the aforesaid for and in consideration of the Circumstances aforesaid as well for and on the further consideration of the sum of Eighteen Hundred and forty nine dollars and thirty cents to me or to be paid by Nathan Pope Jr in two equal annual payments according to the terms and condition of the sale the receipt whereof he partly acknowledge back grant ed bargains, sold and conveyed and by three presents doth grant bargain, sell and convey unto the said Nathan Pope Jr his heirs and assigns the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land containing by a late survey two hundred and ninety eight acres, be the same more or less lying and being with the County of Southampton aforesaid and known by the name of the Hammal's Tract to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land together with the appurtenances
