These Indenture made and entered into this the 19th day of December and the
thensand Eight hundred and twenty nine between George S. Curley of the County of
Amherst and State of Virginia of the first part Peter Edwards and Hubert Middleton of the same County
and State of the second part and Henry Barron of the same County and State of the third part
(Witness the said Henry Barron on the 12th day of January 1839 in order to secure and save
Hazardless the said Peter Edwards and Hubert Middleton from any loss or damage which
they might sustain in consequence of being security for the said Barron in a Bond executed
by the said Henry Barron Peter Edwards & Hubert Middleton as his securities bearing
date the 20th day of December 1827 and made payable to James Jackson for the sum of five
hundred and eight dollars and twenty nine cents due by his Indenture of 21st March 1827
to the said George S. Curley his true Executor and assign the following property to wit
a certain tract or parcel of land on which the said Barron is indebted containing eight
hundred and fifty six acres more or less and which is more particularly described in
the said Deed of Trust and also the following Negroes (to wit) two Negro men
namely Alfred and Moses a Negro woman named Ellen and a Negro Girl named
Diana upon Trust for the use and purposes in the said Indenture mentioned and
whereas since the executing and delivery of the said deed of Trust the said Henry
Barron hath fully satisfied and paid to the said James Jackson the debt aforesaid
whereby the said Hubert Middleton and Peter Edwards are entirely exonerated and
discharged from the security that aforesaid which they have by act and deed
thus Indenture witnessed and for the considerations aforesaid as well as for the considera-
tion of one dollar in hand paid by the said Henry Barron to the said George S. Curley as in
before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
by the said George S. Curley next the aforesaid and approbation of the said Peter Edwards
and Hubert Middleton signified by them having pasted to these presents and the said Peter
Edwards and Hubert Middleton have granted bargained and sold, Remitted, Released and
Confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell Remit Release and Confirm
unto the said Henry Barron all the Estate right title interest claim and demand that
at Law or in Equity which the said George S. Curley and Peter Edwards & Hubert Middleton
have or hold to the land or slave or slaves described to have and to hold the said tract or
parcel of Land together with aforesaid slaves and the increase of the same to the said
Henry Barron his true Executor and assigns forever and the said George S. Curley for himself
his true Executors & assigns the above mentioned land and slaves unto the said Henry Barron
his true Executors and assigns in as full and ample manner as the same may be
availed by the said Henry Barron by the deed of Trust above recited do warrant
the same to the said Henry Barron against the claim or claims of him the said
George S. Curley and all persons claiming by or under him In Witness
whereof the parties of the first and second parts hereunto have set their hands and
affixed their seals the day and year first before written
