 thousand eight hundred and twenty nine Between Benjamin Jordan Patience Dick
 Christian Jordan Joseph Jordan and Rebecca Jordan his wife and Richard Jordan
 all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part And Miles Johnson
 of Northampton County and state of North Carolina of the other part. Witnesseth that the
 said Benjamin Jordan Patience Dick Christian Jordan Joseph Jordan and
 Rebecca his wife and Richard Jordan for and in consideration of the sum of three
 hundred and eighty two dollars and fifty cents current money of the Commonwealth of Vir-
 ginia to them in hand paid by the said Miles Johnson at or before the execution and delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and
 sold and by these presents they and each of them doth grant bargain and sell alien enjoin
 and confirm unto him the said Miles Johnson his heirs and assigns forever One
 certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of
 Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes containing by a late survey ninety two
 he the sum more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a Black oak
 near corner for William Storys line thence along said Samuels Storys
 line of marked trees at 26 1/2 poles thence at 30 poles to a pine thence at
 28 poles to a pine thence at 23 1/2 poles to a corner for said Samuel Story
 in John Thomas line thence along said John Thomas line of marked trees 87 1/2
 poles thence 86 3/4 poles thence 87 poles thence 87 1/2 poles thence 87 1/2 poles thence
 88 1/2 poles thence 86 1/2 poles thence 87 poles to a large pine standing near

 hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Miles Johnson his heirs Executors and assigns
 that they will by these presents warrant and for ever defend the right and title of the said tract
 or parcel of land hereby conveyed and every part and parcel thereof against the
 claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever In Witteness
