Joyner as Trustees for the Baptist Church at Black Oak and their suc. ofors wher the said Church may at present from time to time of the other part all of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Jonathan Lankford and Samuel Turner for and in consideration of the real love that was bear toward true and vital religion do give and grant unto the said Benjamin Griffin and Elg. Joyner as Trustees aforesaid and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Benjamin Griffin and Elg. Joyner as Trustees for the benefit of the Baptist Church at Black Oak in the County aforesaid and their successors in whom the said Church may from time to time of part for ever one certain piece or parcel of Land and premises for the use of the said Church and no other as aforesaid containing by a late survey four acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a small red oak a corner of the poor House standing near the edge of a small branch stream S 80. N 13 poles to another small red oak a corner of said poor House Land thence S 26 E 59 poles to a pine a corner of James Jones line on the side of the road thence along said road S 80 E 13 poles to a small red oak a corner of James Jones line thence S 26 N 10 poles to the first station together with all and singular the houses out houses outhouses buildings with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof for the only proper use and behoof of the Church aforesaid as before expressed unto the said Benjamin Griffin and Elg. Joyner and their successors as aforesaid and the said Jonathan Lankford & Samuel Turner for themselves their heirs and assigns doth by these presents covenant and grant to and with the said Benjamin Griffin and Elg. Joyner as Trustees aforesaid the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land the right and title of which as far as vests in us or our heirs Executors &c. we do warrant and defend by these presents.
