 rented belonging to the Estate of John Parham dec'd consisting of Corn fodder
 Cotton and the balance of my Crop of every description two cows and pig one cow one
 weaver household and kitchen furniture of every description one black man purchased
 at the sale of Thomas Meadon dec'd also my farming utensils of every description
 in special trust and consideration to the intent and purpose that if the aforesaid
 sum of Forty four dollars shall remain unpaid to the said John Story for three months
 after giving ten days notice expose the aforesaid property to public sale at any time
 after the 25th day of December next and with the money arising therefrom first to pay
 satisfy the aforesaid sum of Forty four dollars as also the expense attending the execution
 of this Trust and the surplus if any to return to me my heirs or assigns In Witness
 whereof we the said parties hereunto set our hands and names the 17th day of January one
 Thousand Eight hundred and twenty nine

 Jeremiah Joyner of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the first part and Samuel
 Story of the same County and State of the second and William E Lawrence of the same County
 and State of the third part All witness that whereas the said Jeremiah Joyner
 indebted unto the said Samuel Story in the just and full sum of Forty six
 dollars and a thirty five Cents lawful money of Virginia when it appears by Note
 executed by the said Jeremiah and on all payable the 24th day of this present month
 January 1829 now the said Jeremiah Joyner being desirous to discharge and
 secure the payment of the before mentioned debt but more especially for the sum of
 one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William E Lawrence before the making
 and delivering of these presents whereof as hereby acknowledged that by the said
 Jeremiah Joyner hath granted bargained and sold unto the said W^m E Lawrence
 one mans saddle and furniture two cows one weaver household and kitchen
 one mans fire pig one calf and three cutting chains to him the said William E Lawrence
 to him and his heirs forever upon the following Trust to wit that if the said Jeremiah
 Joyner shall fail to pay and discharge the above debt when required by the said
 Samuel Story at shall be due the duty of the said William E Lawrence so soon as
 requested in writing from under the hand of Samuel Story his own acts or assigns
 to set up and sell for cash the before mentioned property or so much as to pay
