Bales shall request the above mentioned Trust to sell all the said property and Crop of Corn, Hides, Fodder and Cotton by giving Ten days notice at some public place and out of the money arising from the said sale as well as attending the said conveyance and then pay off the Debt aforesaid with all the interest and the balance of any pay to the said William Schollar then this indenture be void or else to remain in full force and virtue In Witness whereof the said parties of these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written
