James Jones & wife

Indenture made and entered into this eleventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between James Jones and Martha his wife, Thomas Simpson a minor of the third part, and Ralph Graves of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia in Mississippi.

That whereas the said Thomas Simpson administrator of James Jones deceased who was guardian of Elizabeth A. Gold as aforesaid on the eleventh day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty four in the Superior Court of Law for Southampton County obtained an award of execution by motion on a bond commonly called a bond for coming or delivering Bond against Charles H. Graves the said James Jones and one Robert Carter for the sum of two thousand six hundred and fifty seven dollars and twenty nine cents the penalty of said bond for coming or delivering Bond and also his costs by the said Thomas Simpson a minor as aforesaid by him in that behalf expended But the same to be discharged by the payment of one thousand three hundred and twenty eight dollars and eighty five cents with interest thereon at six percent of annual from the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty three till paid and the Costs and before the said Court the plaintiff made motion for an Award of Execution in case to the defendant the sum of seven dollars and twenty cents the said Execution where awarded has since issued from the Office of the Clerk of said Superior Court of Law and is now in the hands of the Sheriff or his Deputy of the County aforesaid Now this Indenture further witnesseth that the said James Jones for and in consideration of his premises and for a sum in Consideration of one dollar to him the said James Jones and Martha his wife in hand paid by the said Ralph Graves at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby unequivocally acknowledged by them and each of them and done and done from thay do and each of them doth accept and discharge the said Ralph Graves his executors administrators or assigns forever by these presents and for better securing the payment of the debt soe as and for divers good causes hereunto mentioned the said James Jones and Martha his wife have and each of them has granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant of them doth for themselves their and their heirs administrators or executors grant bargains sell alien enfeoff and confer unto him the said Ralph Graves her heirs executors or assigns all that certain plantation tract of land or parcel of Land situate by improved being in the County of Southampton on Eighty two acre swamp and adjoining the lands of William West James West and Thomas Gray and the same lands which formerly belonged to Anslem Jones &c the father of the said James Jones and was sold by Commissioner appointed by a decree of the County Court of Southampton and the same James Jones became the purchaser thereof which tract of Land contains by estimation three hundred acres more or less together with all singular the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining And the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of them or either of them the said James Jones and Martha his wife their and either of them his executors or administrators of and to the said lands premises and the appurtenances aforesaid and the said James Jones for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid hath further bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant and sell unto the said Ralph Graves the following named property a negro man Harry a negro woman Blacy & her four children namely Pharris dothle Jimmy and Rachell one Sorel Horse one Black Horse a boy mare and young Colt a still Cap and Worm ten Head of Cattle including two studs four oxen three peacock Birds and furniture two tables all the household furniture and plantation utensils consisting of ploughs plough gear ox cart timber
