This Indenture made and entered into this nineteenth day of January
one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between Ralph Graves of the County
of James (who was Trustee between James Jones and Martha his wife and Thomas
Simpson administrator of James Simpons estate who was Guardian of Elizabeth et al.)
of the first part and Thomas P Gray of the County of Southampton of the second part
Witnesseth that whereas the said James Jones and Martha his wife by a certain
Indenture commonly called a Trust Deed bearing date the twelfth day of May one
thousand eight hundred and twenty five and recorded in the Office of the Clerk
of Surry on the twelfth day of May in the year last aforesaid did grant bargain
and sell unto the said Ralph Graves Trustee as aforesaid his Executor ad Administratrix
all that certain messuage tenement tract piece or parcel of Land situate and lying and
being in the County of Southampton on Lightwood Swamp and adjoining the land of
William West, James West and Thomas Gray and so the same land which
formerly belongs to Anselm Jones dec'd the father of the said James Jones
and was sold by Commissioners appointed by a decree of the County Court of Southampton
and the said James Jones became the purchaser thereof which said tract of Land
contains by estimation three hundred acres more or less together with all and singular
the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the several
and severals remainder and remainder of party and other rights issues and profits
thereof in trust for the purpose of securing to the said Thomas Simpson aforesaid
aforesaid a certain sum of money mentioned and wher as the said James Jones having
made default and failing to pay the sum in said sum mentioned the said Ralph
Graves Trustee as aforesaid at the special instance and request of the said Thomas
Simpson having first advertised the time and place of sale at the Town of Jerusalem
in the County of Southampton for more than twenty days previous thereto did in execu-
tion of the trust referred in this and by virtue of the aforesaid deed on the 19th day of
January the present instant expose the aforesaid Land with its appurtenances
aforesaid at public Auction to the highest bidder in the Town of Jerusalem
in the County of Southampton aforesaid and the said Thomas P Gray became the
purchaser thereof at the sum of two hundred and fifty eight dollars Current
money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas P Gray at and before
the insuring and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Ralph
Graves Trustee as aforesaid doth hereby acknowledge and chuse acquit the said
Thomas P Gray his heirs executors of the said Ralph Graves as Trustee aforesaid
hath granted bargain and sold unto the said Thomas P Gray his heirs and
affligns forever the land aforesaid mentioned and which was conveyed to the said
Ralph Graves by the Trust deed aforesaid together with the appurtenances
thereto belonging in the same as the same is annexed to him by the said
P. Gray and to hold the said Land together with all and singular the premises
and appurtenances unto the said Thomas P Gray his heirs and affligns forever
free from the claim or claims of him the said Ralph Graves his heirs and affligns
and from the claim or claims of all and every other person whatsoever claiming by or
through him but against none others whatsoever In witness whereof the said
Ralph Graves as Trustee aforesaid hath countersigned this Indenture seal the day
