 State of Virginia Whereas the said Matthew Bulls is justly indebted unto the
 said Henry Lenon in the sum of Eighty dollars and 50^{cts} by Bond bearing
 date the 6th day of March with interest theron also paid which said
 said Henry Bulls is willing and desirous to secure NOW This
 Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises
 and also for the further sum of one dollar of Lawful money of Virginia
 to the said Matthew Bulls in hand paid by the said James Council at or
 before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt is hereby acknowl-
 edged and the said Matthew Bulls has given granted bargained and sold released
 and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the
 said James Council his heirs and assigns the following property to wit
 a Parcel of land with Cap and worm a sorrel horse a pair of Cart wheels
 two Blade stacks of fodder 10th Barrels of Corn and ten Barrels of wheat
 with all the interest right title claim or demand of the within
 mentioned property To have and to hold the said Henry Grants or assigns
 to be in and to the property hereby conveyed unto the said James Council his
 heirs and assigns and the said James Council his heirs and assigns
 do hereby covenant and agree with the said James Council his heirs and assigns
 that the said Matthew Bulls his heirs and assigns shall and lawfully shall
 mentioned property unto the said James Council his heirs and assigns
 against all persons whatsover shall and well warrant and defend
