of the said slaves also the team horses one wagon and harness one cotton box or as many
thereof sufficient to pay the aforesaid sum of money interest and costs thereby accounting
at public sale for cash after giving twenty days notice by advertisement at the nearest
public place in the County and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after deducting
the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said
John Maddall his heirs executors and assigns the aforesaid sum with the interest
which may thereon accrue and the balance if any shall pay to the said John
Boykin his heirs executors and assigns but if the whole of the said sum of twenty
four hundred dollars together with the interest shall be fully paid off and dis-
charged to the said John Maddall his heirs executors and assigns on or before the
25th day of December in this present year 1839 when the sum is payable so
that no default of payment of the said sum of twenty four hundred dollars and
interest be made then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force
and virtue In witness whereof we the parties to these presents have hereunto

to him the said Garrison Parker the accept whereof is hereby acknowledged by the
said Garrison Parker has by him granted bargained and sold unto him the said Patrick
Dobles and to his heirs and assigns forever all the Cypress Timber contained situated and being
on the land held and owned by the said Dobles or a tontiney River in the County of South-
ampton which said land was purchased of John & Chapman and his wife Jane to
have and to hold unto the said Patrick Dobles his heirs executors and assigns
timber with all right title and interest therein fully and effectually with the
privileges hereby secured to him the said Patrick Dobles his heirs executors and
of always having and enjoying fully and uninterrupted the right on the said land
to remove and convey the said timber to the said River tontiney for transpor-
