

they the said John Waddell his heirs Executors and assigns shall request the said Stephen Muddaugh to sell the aforesaid slave together with the an article of the furniture of the said slave also the furniture one wagon and harness one cotton gin or as many more of sufficient to pay the aforesaid sum of money interest and costs thereby accruing at public sale for cash after giving twenty days notice by advertisement at three or more public places in the County and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after deducting the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said John Waddell his heirs Executors and assigns the aforesaid sum with the interest which may thereon accrue and the balance if any shall be paid to the said John Boykin his heirs Executors and assigns but if the whole of the said sum of twenty four hundred dollars together with the interest shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said John Waddell his heirs Executors and assigns on or before the 25th day of December in this present year 1829 when the same is payable so that no default of payment of the said sum of twenty four hundred dollars and interest be made then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue In Witness whereof we the parties to these presents have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and year first above written

This Indenture made the sixteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between Harrison Tarker administrator of Henry Gardner dec'd of Southampton County state of Virginia of the one part and Patrick Woles of the above named County and state of the other part Witnesseth that he and in consideration of the sum of thirty five dollars Ten Cents on hand paid by the said Patrick Woles to him the said Harrison Tarker the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Harrison Tarker has given granted bargained and sold unto him the said Patrick Woles and to his heirs and assigns forever all the Cypress Timber contained and being on the lands held and owned by the said Patrick Woles or his Father in the County of Southampton which said land was purchased of John H Chapman and his wife Anne &c have and to hold unto the said Patrick Woles his heirs Executors and assigns the said Cypress timber with all right title and interest therein fully and effectually with the privileges hereby secured to him the said Patrick Woles his heirs Executors and assigns of Always having and enjoying fully and uninterruptedly the right on the said land to remove and convey the said Timber to the said River of the James for transportation or make whatever other use of said Timber he please In Witness whereof I Harrison Tarker have hereunto set my hand and seal this day & date above named
