This Indenture made the twentieth day of February in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty nine between Drowy Bottle of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Murdough of the same County of the other part witness by the last Will and Testament of John Murdough now of record in the County Court of Southampton the said Testator devised to his son Thomas Murdough certain tracts or parcels of Land situate in the said County of Southampton with command on to the said Drowy Bottle of Samuel Bryant upon the said devise dying without issue legitimate or children at the time of his death and whom as the said Thomas Murdough being now the said Drowy Bottle in possession of the said tracts or parcels of Land and yet the said Drowy Bottle being desirous to dispose of his interest or expectancy therein and the said James Murdough being willing to purchase the same This Indenture therefore Witnesseth that the said Drowy Bottle in consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirty five dollars to him in hand paid by the said James Murdough at and before the making & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns all the right title interest claim and demand which the said Drowy Bottle now hath or may hereafter have in and to the several tracts or parcels of Land aforesaid together with all and singular the tenements and appurtenances to the same belonging appertaining to have and to hold the said right title interest claim and demand which the said Drowy Bottle now hath or may hereafter have in and to the several tracts or parcels
