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John W. Pease or his representative have any of the said money to pay or  
 or in case himself in danger of suffering by reason of the securityship aforesaid  
 that then and in that case it shall be lawful and declared to be the sole  
 intent and meaning of these presents for the said Middleton or his Representa-  
 tive to sell for cash the aforesaid negro slaves in the Town of Scranton  
 after giving at least ten days notice of the time and place of sale and one  
 of the proceeds of sale first pay and satisfy all sums of money  
 which the said John W. Pease shall have paid as well that which he may  
 be most likely to have by any means consequences of the securityship aforesaid  
 and the balance pay over to the said Brewry & Pittle or his representative  
 But should the said Brewry & Pittle pay and discharge the sum Bond  
 so that the said John W. Pease shall be wholly exonerated and discharged  
 that then and in that case it shall be lawful for the said Middleton  
 as Trustee aforesaid at the request of the said John W. Pease or his  
 Representative to make released give a quitance and release of the said  
 negro slaves and it is moreover by the parties thereto the said Brewry  
 & Pittle shall remain in peaceable and quiet possession of the said negro  
 slaves until they shall be demanded by the said Middleton or his Representa-  
 tive In witness whereof the parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed  
 their seals this day of January 1829
