This Indenture made this the seventeenth of April in the year of our Lord 1729  
between Geo. Gurley of the County of W<sup>ch</sup>hampton of the first  
part to wit James Roche Samuel Peckholson & Edward Geo. Thomas; & persons  
to wit James Roche Elizabeth Keale all which persons are of the County of W<sup>ch</sup>hampton  
aforesaid. In witness whereof the said Geo. Gurley in consideration of the sum  
the debts and obligations in which he stands to the foregoing parties with a sum  
them or save them harmless against the same, as also for the further consideration of  
one dollar paid to him by the said William Robert Allison which gave grant  
bargain sold alien enfeoff and confirmed and by these presents does give grant  
bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm to the said William Robert Allison all the  
right title and interest in a certain tract of Land whereon Geo. Gurley resided and to  
to which interest the said Geo. Gurley is entitled as one of the heirs of the said Geo.  
Gurley also all the stocks of every kind to wit Cows, Sheep and other  
animals constituting a Farmes Stock, also two mans all the household and kitchen  
furniture the plantation utensils, the Corn and fodder, all the debts due to him the  
said Geo. Gurley whether by Bond bill note, or open account, one double Bay  
one pair of Cart wheels, his interest in the tract of Land on which the said Geo.  
Gurley was residing derived to him by marriage with Lucy Roche the lands  
whereof and other tenements may be ascertained by reference to the record in the Court of  
of W<sup>ch</sup>hampton County, his interest in the tract of Land late in possession of Bro.  
Roche dec<sup>d</sup> of which he and seized and proposed to have one to hold the aforesaid  
mentioned property thereby conveyed or intended to be conveyed unto the said William  
Robert Allison, his heirs and assigns forever, upon this especial trust and confidence  
nevertheless that the said William Robert Allison shall sell at public sale  
or auction all or any part of the said property herein mentioned and conveyed or by  
these premises intended to be conveyed upon such terms and at such place as he shall  
prescribe and pay to the persons above mentioned in the order in which they are  
named the respective debts which may be found to be due to each by the said Geo.  
Gurley by reason of any security or otherwise with this exception that  
that if the property conveyed by these premises should be insufficient to pay the  
said Roche Lemuel Peckholson and Ed Edward their respective  
debts, in case that it shall be lawful, and it is required of the said William  
Robert Allison to pay the said persons proportionally as and according to the  
several amounts of the said named persons debts, and without further exception that  
the said John M. Gurley being bound as the security of the said Geo. Gurley in the  
County of W<sup>ch</sup>hampton, nor forfeited at the suit of Levi Gray and Stephen Wells, is  
required of the said William Robert Allison to apply the money collected to the  
Collectors of the several Constables into whose hands the said Geo. Gurley has  
placed his accounts, to the payment and satisfaction of said Bonds or Executions  
thereon and if money collected by said Constables be insufficient to pay off said  
satisfy the said Bonds then it is required of the said William Robert Allison to sell  
so much of the property hereby conveyed or intended to be conveyed as may be necessary  
to raise the amount of said Bonds or Executions in which the parties h<sup>th</sup> admitted  
himself and affixes this date the day and year first above written Geo. Gurley
