that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of
the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said Geo. G. Gray hundred
by the said Jeremiah Cobb at or before the concluding delivery of these presents the word
whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Geo. G. Gray having granted bargin and
sold and by these presents does give grant bargin and sell to the said Jeremiah Cobb
his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia containing forty acres and a quarter acres
be the same more or less and bounded as follows. First, Beginning at a dogwood in
West Cobb's line distance S. 60° 2' W. 32 poles to a post oak S. 68° W. 111 p to a pine S. 12° W. 111 p
to a pine N. 31° 3' W. 113 poles to a gum a corner of Richard Lommons Land then west
36° W. 125 p. to a corner in the road thence N. 80° E. 87 1/2 p. to two dogwoods a corner.
thence N. 38° E. 91 1/2 p. to the Beginning with all and singular land so appertaining to the
