The said Thomas Harrison doth for myself and my heirs warrant and forever defend the title of the above said land and improvements the negroes and their increase and all other property hereby conveyed against the claims and demands of myself and against the claim and demands of self and every other person or persons in that over. Upon Trust that in witness of that it is and may be lawful for the said William Elwell upon information hereunto by John A. Persons that he wishes the amount of this debt to be paid or that he was satisfied that sufficient by the before named receipt ship or being satisfied by other the parties by giving twenty day public notice of the time and place of sale at two or more the most public places in the neighborhood proceed to sell for cash at public auction the property hereby conveyed or so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay off the note to John A. Persons or so much as shall settle and pay all the recently debts before mentioned or so much as may be due on them and all reasonable expenses attending such sale. And upon further Trust that the said Wm Elwell suffered the said Thomas Harrison to remain in quiet possession of said property until the day of sale.
