 Sampson E. Reese of the other part of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
 Whereby it is that the said Thomas S. Harper and Mary This wife for and in consideration of the sum of
 seven hundred and ten dollars lawful money of the United States to them well paid by the
 said Sampson E. Reese at or before the ratifying and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold, sold by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said
 Sampson E. Reese his heirs and assigns the plantation on which the said Thomas S. Harper
 and Mary This wife now lawfully and lawfully known and designated by the name of Cape Henry and
 the several tracts attached thereto together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto
 in any way or appertaining to the said tract of land and the several tracts attached thereto and the remain-
 der or remainders therein and other lands, tenements and profits thereof and of every part and parcel
 thereof to have and to hold the said hereby granted lands and tenements and the several
 tracts attached thereto and every part or parcel thereof to the only proper use and behoof of the
 said Sampson E. Reese his heirs and assigns forever and the said Thomas S. Harper and
 Mary This wife shall and lawfully covenants warrant and defend, the right and title of the
 said tract or parcel of land and its appurtenances and the several tracts attached thereto
 and their appurtenances unto the said Thomas S. Harper his heirs and assigns forever
 In witness whereof the said Thomas S. Harper and Mary This wife have
 hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year above written

for and in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars to me then paid by Amos Stephenson of the said County 18
before the date and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge in witness whereof
and sold & granted and confirmed and by these presents do bargain sell and confirm with said
Amos Stephenson a certain female negre slave named Lenzia a Slave and to hold the said
female negre slave and the future increase thereof by propriety and behoof of the said Amos
Stephenson his Executors administrators and assigns forever And I the said Thomas Underwood
for myself my Executors and administrators the said female negre slave with the future
increase to the said Amos Stephenson his Executors administrators and assigns a good and lawful
said Thomas Underwood my Executors administrators and assigns shall and will lawfully
and for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
