This Indenture made this 9th day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty nine Between Joshua Hutchings of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Lewis Harris of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that whereas the said Joshua Hutchings in or due to some other payment of the following debt (To wit) one written obligation under the hand and seal of the said Joshua Hutchings executed to John Gray the ninth day of the present month of April as above stated for the sum of thirty dollars and seventy one cents on and the 1st day of August next, he the said Joshua Hutchings did grant bargain and sell unto the said Lewis Harris the following property to wit one dark bay horse one black Bay and Furniture all my ensuing crop consisting of corn fodder and Wheat To have and to hold the said bargain and sold property unto him the said Lewis Harris his heirs Executors administrators & assigns forever Upon These Several Conditions That he the said Joshua Hutchings shall fail to make true and faithful payment of the debt above mentioned with interest and costs that may accrue thereon on or before the first day of August next ensuing that then or that thereafter the said Lewis Harris as trustee in this Indenture at the request of the said John Gray shall after having advertised the same and placed of sale at least ten days previous thereto proceed to sell the property herein before mentioned to the highest bidder for ready money and out of the money arising from the sale in the first place pay and satisfy all reasonable charges attending such and then the debt above mentioned and the residue of the money if any arising from such sale as aforesaid to the said Joshua Hutchings his heirs Executors administrators & assigns In Witness whereof the parties to this Indenture have hereunto set their hands and seals the day & year first above written.
