This Indenture made the 20th day of April Anno Domini 1829 between James Harrison of Southampton County of the first part William L. Everitt of the second part Benjamin & Co. Turner & Co. William Jones and Henry Moore all of the County of Southampton of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said James Harrison stands jointly indebted to the said Benjamin & Co. Turner & Co. in the first and said sum of One hundred dollars and eighty nine cents by note and bearing date the 1st day of August 1828. and on demand the same due also to the said Wm. A. Jones on the 1st day of January 1829 and on demand the same due also to the said Henry Moore on the 1st day of January 1829 and on demand the same due also to the said Wm. A. And whereas the said James Harrison desires and willing to sell the aforesaid debts unto them the said Benjamin & Co. Turner & Co. William A. Jones and Henry Moore. And that the said James Harrison in consideration of the premises and the purchase consideration of one dollar to him the said James Harrison in hand paid by the said William L. Everitt the receipt or acknowledgment given or granted bargained and sold and confirmed and by these presents give grant bargain and sell unto the said William L. Everitt his heirs and assigns the following property to wit: One negro Man whose name Charles one bay horse and one pig and the said James Harrison for himself his heirs and assigns doth by these presents warrant and defend the title of the said property Charles Horse and Pig unto the said William L. Everitt his heirs and assigns forever upon Special Covenants that the said William L. Everitt shall suffer the aforesaid property Charles Horse and Pig to remain in the quiet possession of him the said James Harrison until the 25th day of April next and after that day by the instruction of either of the parties to the deed shall by giving fifteen days notice at two or more public places in the neighborhood of the said property to public sale for ready money the aforesaid property and out of the proceeds of such sale first pay all reasonable expenses attending such sale then pay to Benjamin & Co. Turner & Co. the amount that may be then due on the note before named and then with all interest thereon accruing 2nd to William A. Jones the amount of the note with all interest thereon accruing that may be then due 3^d then pay to Henry Moore the amount of the note and interest and lastly of any balance remaining in the hands of him the said William L.
