My Indenture made this 13 day March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between Charles Planton and a Nancy his wife both of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the one part and myself David Brown of the same County and State aforesaid of the said State witnesseth that whereas the said Charles Planton and a Nancy his wife do and doth acknowledge of the sum of fifty four dollars to him paid by the said witness David Brown the receipt whereof hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold Conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant and give full power and Convey to the said Plaintiff David Brown of the County and State aforesaid a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid State aforesaid and containing by a late survey eighteen acres to be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a white oak tree standing on the south side of a branch of a stream running through the land belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the only property and before her the said Plaintiff David Brown his heirs and assigns forever unto the said Charles Planton and a Nancy his wife so for themselves their heirs and assigns in amount and form as per the land and premises against the right title claim or interest of all and every other person whatsoever It is witness whereof we the said Charles Planton and a Nancy his wife have hereunto set our hands and seals the day & date above written
