This Indenture made and entered into the 26th day of April 1829 between Edwin Gray of the first part William Bland of the second part and John Bland of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia whosefelf shall wherefore the said Edwin Gray himself in debt to the said John Bland in a sum amounting to the sum of One hundred and thirty dollars bearing date and on demand the 25th day of December next and the said Edwin Gray promising to remain in peace to the said John Bland the amount of the aforesaid bond amounting to the aforesaid sum of one hundred and thirty dollars together with the legal interest which may thereon accrue have agreed to convey certain property herein after to be named & to be known as follows This Indenture further witnesseth that the said Edwin Gray for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid agrees for in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him the said Edwin Gray in hand paid by the said William Bland the receipt whereof before the making and delivery of these presents is hereby acknowledged bargained sold and delivered these presents grants bargains sell and conveys to the said William Bland his executors and the following his heirs, One bay horse unbroken and furnished house hold and kitchen furniture of every description To have and to hold the aforesaid property to the said William Bland his heirs or executors and the said Edwin Gray hereby covenants to warrant and defend the right and title of the above conveyed property to the said William Bland his executors and the said Edwin Gray shall and truly pay to the said John Bland the amount of the aforementioned together with interest at thence when he the said Gray shall require so to do after the said bond become due the said Indenture to be void and of no effect but if the said Edwin Gray shall fail to discharge the amount of the aforesaid bond with the interest thereon when the same shall be come due then the said William Bland his executors and the said John Bland his executors shall at the request of the said John Bland his executors sell and sell at Public Auction to the highest bidder for cash thereon to be designated by the parties hereto having previously given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale date and the proceeds of said sale the said William Bland his executors are to dispose of as follows first pay the expenses incurred in the execution of this trust then pay to the said John Bland his executors the amount of the aforesaid bond or such part thereof as may be due thereon together with the interest which may thereon legally have accrued & the surplus if any pay over to the said Edwin Gray or to his order and the said John Bland and William Bland hereby covenant to let the said property remain in the quiet possession of the said Edwin Gray until the said William Bland may have legal authority to dispose of the same In Testimony whereof the parties to these presents have caused to set their hands and affixed their seals the day of April last above written.

I recd This Indenture made this fifteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine Between George Grey of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia whosefelf the one party and Bland Bland of the County and State aforesaid of the other party whosefelf the said George Grey in order to secure the payment of the following debt of £100, one hundred pounds sterling under the hand and seal of the said George Grey executed to John Bland the 15th day of the present month April as above stated for the sum of two hundred and forty five dollars On demand of the said George Grey shall grant bargain and sell unto the said Bland Bland the following negroes to wit A color woman and girl both to have and to hold the said bargain and sold as aforesaid unto the said John Bland his heirs executors administrators & assigns for ever Upon Trust nevertheless and upon this Express condition that if the said George Grey shall fail to make true and faithful payment of the debt aforesaid with interest and cost that may accrue thereon
