Gardner That Indenture made and entered into the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April, Eight hundred and twenty nine  
between Thomas Calvert on the first part, James Rochelle of the second part and James D. Mapfeling  
Rochelle the third part Whereas the said Thomas Calvert is unable to name & pay the sum of  
one hundred & dollars, Messrs. Rice as representative of Edward Ward the sum of forty five dollars  
and John Horn the representative of William Edward one hundred and twenty seven dollars  
\$ 400. and to Alex Edwards as representative of James Edwards sixty three dollars 8 3/4 pds.  
In This Indenture it is agreed that for and consideration of the sum aforesaid the said  
John Horn in consideration of one dollar current money in hand paid by the said James Rochelle he has  
said Thomas Calvert hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give  
grant bargain and sell unto him the said Rochelle his Esq: or at his direction the following slaves  
to wit negro man Peter, Arch and Dick and all right title and interest of the said Thomas  
Calvert in and to said Slave S. H. Hancock to hold and slaves with him who said James Rochelle  
the bushes Executors administrators or assigns upon his death left that he said Land  
Rochelle shall permit said Thomas Calvert to remain in the possession of said Slaves until  
until default in the payment of said debt or a part of them and then upon such failure  
trust that the said James Rochelle shall at his own discretion or upon request of said  
James D. Mapfeling sell said slaves or many there part may be necessary for cash  
either at public auction after due notice of the time and place of sale or privately in short before  
Market as may be most expedient and shall out of the proceeds of said sale defray the  
expenses of this Indenture and all of the aforesaid debt or such of them as may remain unpaid  
and that residue of any may over to the said Thomas Calvert his heirs Esq: or  
assigns In witness whereof we put our hands and seals this day & date

That Indenture made the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand and  
Eight hundred and twenty nine between James Gardner of the County of Lancaster  
in the State of Virginia of the one part and Lawrence Gardner of the County of Southampton  
in the other part Whereas it is hereby acknowledged by the said James Gardner Esq:  
and by the said Lawrence Gardner at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents she  
doth receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Gardner hath granted bargain  
and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Lawrence Gardner  
his husband a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid  
County of Southampton. Marks and boundaries as follows Beginning at a black Gum  
near a branch adjoining Harry Paul's line and thence adjoining the lands of said Paul &  
Joseph Baston and William Ellis containing twenty five acres more or less the reversion and  
reversionary remainder and remainder of early and other rents issues and profits thereof and  
every part and parcel thereof. It have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and
