Alexander Pitts as representative of Edward Packer the sum of Eighty five dollars and John H. Morris the representative of William Howard and twenty seven dollars. For and to the use of Edward Packer representative of James M. Maplesburg the sum of thirty three dollars 83^{cts} 00^{cts}. In the Indenture it is expressed that for and in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of one dollar current money in hand paid by the said James M. Maplesburg to the said Thomas Calvert hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto him the said Rochelle his heirs Executors or assigns the following slaves to wit, negro man Ebenezer a Irish man Jack and all right title and interest of the said Thomas Calvert in and to said slave To Have and to hold said slave unto him the said James M. Maplesburg his heirs Executors administrators or assigns upon Tru revocable left that the said James Rochelle shall permit said Thomas Calvert to remain in the possession of said slave until default in the payment of said debts or a part of them and then upon the further Trust that the said James Rochelle shall at his own discretion or upon request of said James M. Maplesburg sell said slave or so many thereof as may be necessary for cash either at public auction after due notice of the time and place of sale or privately in the open market as may so most expedient and shall out of the proceeds of said sale defray the expenses of this Trust and all of the aforesaid debts or such of them as may appear unpaid and the residue of any money to the said Thomas Calvert his heirs Executors or assigns In Witness whereof we put our hand and seal this day aforesaid before written
