This Indenture made this 15th day of December A.D. 1828 between Robert G. Simmons and Samuel Kello of said County of Southampton and State of Virginia on the one part & Geo. H. Cray of the County and State aforesaid on the other part WITNESSETH that the said Robert G. Simmons and Samuel Kello for and in consideration of the sum of thirty English Dollars 7⁵ Cents current money of the State of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Geo. H. Cray in full before the entering and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold alien conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell alien convey and confirm to the said Geo. H. Cray his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing by a recent survey seven & 1/2 acres to the more or less (beginning at a Hickory a corner tree of said tract and Henry Briggs' Soldier's tract then about 75⁰ E 25⁰ N to two oak N 75⁰ E 43⁰ to a pine a corner of said tract and also Henry Briggs' line along said Briggs' line the same course two poles to a dogwood N 67⁰ E 25⁰ to a hickory on said Briggs' line a new corner between Simmons & Kello & Geo. H. Cray then about 51 N 87⁰ 5⁰ to a corner in the village of Briggs' road thence about 35 E 85⁰ to the hickory at the beginning) to have and to hold the above granted premises together with all the appurtenances and priviledges to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said Geo. H. Cray his heirs and assigns forever or if his heirs ever proper use and habit for ever. And the said Robert G. Simmons and Samuel Kello for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators do covenant with the said Geo. H. Cray his heirs & assigns that they are lawfully seized in fee of the above granted premises and well possessed and defend the title to the same to the said Geo. H. Cray his heirs & assigns forever against all lawfull claims or demands of any person or persons whatsoever. WITNESSETH whereof we have subscribed hands & seals the day & year first above written
