Indenture made and entered into on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March, in the year of our Lord Eight hundred and twenty nine Between James Pope and Polly his wife of the one part and Jacob Barnes of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that the said James Pope and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty seven current money of this commonwealth to him or her paid by the said Jacob Barnes at or before the making and delivery of this indenture the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by the parties they and each of them doth grant bargain sell alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land situate by map and survey the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes containing by estimation Fifty Eight and three quarters acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows: Beginning at a Hickory a corner in James Worrell's line thence along his line of marked trees N 45° E 6 poles thence S 55° E 14 poles thence S 45° E 20 poles thence S 51° E 9 poles to a large pine a corner for said Jacob Barnes in said James Worrell's line thence along said Jacob Barnes' line N 17° W 36 1/2 poles to a dead tree thence S 45° E 8 poles to a pine a corner thence S 71° E 45 1/2 poles thence S 68° W 34 poles to a light wood post a corner for said Augustine Pope or Polly his wife thence along said Augustine Pope's line of marked trees N 35° E 13 poles to a small oak a corner for said James Worrell thence along his line same course S 35° E 128 1/2 poles to the beginning Together with all right title interest claim or demand of in and to the said tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold the same descended tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances thereunto belonging unto him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns forever he and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns and the said James Pope and Polly his wife for themselves their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever and agree to and with the said Jacob Barnes his heirs Executors and assigns that they and each of them will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every persons or persons whatsoever And Witness whereof the said James Pope and Polly his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date first above written
