This Indenture made and entered into on the 31st day of March in the year of our
 Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty nine between Matthew Vick and Patience Fick his wife
 of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Mary Story of
 the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Matthew Vick and
 Patience his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and Eighty nine
 dollars and seven Cents current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid
 by the said Mary Story at and before the making and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted conveyed and sold
 aliened Enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do and each of them with
 grant bargain sell alien Enfeoff and convey unto the said Mary Story
 his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of Land situated lying and
 being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke's containing
 by late survey one hundred and seven and one third acres be the same more or less and
 bounded as follows To wit Beginning at the Bridge across the Appomattox River
 Reville's line also a corner for said Matthew Fick thence along said Fick's line N 35° E 66
 poles to a small pine stump N 21° E 92 poles to a post on a corner for said Fick thence along
 his line S 57° E 66 poles to a small pine and post thence S 13° E 66 poles to a stake standing
 in a ditch thence along the ditch South 40° 30 poles to a stake a corner thence S 60° E 114
 thence S 57° E 66 poles to the run of a large branch a corner in said branch thence
 down the run of said Branch to the run of said Fick's property thence with the various
 courses of the run of said branch to the Beginning together with all right title
 interest claim or demand of law and to the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its
 appurtenances thence belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold
 the above described tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances
 thence belonging unto the said Mary Story his heirs and assigns forever do and for the
 only proper use and behoof of her the said Mary Story his heirs or assigns forever
 and the said Matthew Vick and Patience his wife for themselves their heirs Executors
 administrators do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Mary Story
 his heirs Executors administrators that they will by these presents warrant
 and forever defend the right and title of the said tract of Land and premises and
 every part or parcel thereof against themselves their heirs and legal representatives
 only In Witness whereof the said Matthew Vick and Patience his wife
 have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date first within
